Conducted by the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA), N-SSATS is designed to collect data on the location, characteristics and use of alcoholism and drug abuse treatment facilities and services throughout the 50 states, the District of Columbia and other U.S. jurisdictions. PFS-908 Underage Alcohol Use: from the National Survey on Drug Use and Health

(limit: 1) book

This report focuses on alcohol-consumption by persons age 12 to 20 (under the legal drinking age). It examines trend, variations in underage alcohol use and disorders among demographic and geographic subgroups and information about the social context of locations of underage drinking. The discussion is based on measures of alcohol use in the past month, past year and lifetime included in NSDUH, as well as questions that allow for the classification of past year dependence on or abuse of alcohol. PFS-962 Patterns of Mental Health Service Utilization and Substance Use Among Adults

This report presents data for respondents aged 18 or older from the combined 2000 and 2001 NHSDA and is therefore the largest nationally representative study of the prevalence of mental health treatment and substance use among adults to date. Annual average estimates presented include the prevalence of mental health treatment among adults, the types of treatment received and the characteristics of persons receiving treatment, including their substance use, abuse and treatment for problems with substance use.
